

ST ALOYSIUS GONZAGA



Born into a noble family in Castiglione, Italy, St Aloysius was the heir to the throne of the Marquisate of Gonzaga in Italy.

Though groomed for a military career, St Aloysius spent his time with poor young men, instead of joining the military training. Inspired by a deep spirit of faith and moved by a deep love for his fellow persons, at the age of 18 he abdicated his rights and entered the Jesuit Order to be a religious whose wealth would be God alone and whose happiness would be the service of others. St Aloysius studied under St Robert Bellarmine SJ, who acted as his spiritual adviser.

In 1591, a plague swept over Rome. St Aloysius volunteered to serve at the Jesuit-established hospital, where he and his fellow Jesuits worked directly with the infected.

St Aloysius begged for alms for the victims and also worked to feed and clean those affected by the epidemic. He contracted the plague and his health declined quickly.

St. Aloysius Gonzaga died in Rome on June 21, 1591, at the age of 23. St Aloysius motivates us to strive to serve others by reaching out to the poor, marginalized and suffering.

The Annual Report of the academic year 2020-2021 portrays the wide spectrum of academic and co-curricular activities in the college. Year 2020 marked the outbreak of global pandemic posing unforeseen difficulties, unprecedented challenges which had to be dealt with courage and diligence. The College pivoted quickly to continue training the students through a socially distanced model; a vast undertaking completed with speed and precision. The notable contributions made by the faculty members and management helped to maintain a trajectory of steady and sustained growth even in hard times like these.

What stands today as a complex educational institution in a lush green environment had its inception 141 years ago which began by serving a few hundred students. It is now catering to the educational needs of more than 4000 students from all over the country. This premier educational institution seeks to establish a congenial learning environment for students of diverse cultural and religious backgrounds. Guided by the motto 'Lucet et Ardet', Shine to Enkindle, the students commit themselves to spread the light of knowledge and wisdom and kindle the ardour of faith thereby forming men and women for and with others.

The college believes in the integral role played not just by academics but also in extra-curricular and co-curricular activities in shaping the overall personality of a student. Time and again this institution has strived to go beyond the classroom walls and textbooks to augment learning. The efficaciousness of this balanced view can be seen in board exam results of the second year pre-university students wherein the college secured an overall percentage of 98.38, with several district toppers and four state toppers.

At St Aloysius Pre-University College, the COVID-19 crisis has not stifled the institution's commitment towards providing its students with uninterrupted access to learning and opportunities for holistic growth.

In its constant efforts to provide its students with opportunities for learning through both academics and activities, the college has initiated online classes and a multitude of creative online courses such as Basic French, Communication Skills Enhancement, Information Technology, and Ecology. The college offers exceptional student care strategies to support them to reach their academic goals.

To train students to strengthen their skills and flourish holistically, the college conducted over twenty-five webinars on diverse topics such as Python Programming, French Pronunciation, preparations for competitive exams in the New Normal, Career Guidance, Artificial Intelligence, Culinary Evolution. Free online CET/NEET crash courses were conducted for students appearing for the competitive exams. 'Manvanthara', a plethora of online cultural and intellectual competitions was hosted for the students to provide them with a platform to exhibit their talents during pandemic.

The college also believes in walking the extra mile in times of anxiety and uncertainty and has initiated an e-counselling facility and online peer support forum and parenting sessions which have been well received. The college had also conducted online retreats to offer our catholic students a strong spiritual foundation.

The COVID-19 crisis has presented us with a situation unlike anything we had faced in the past. St Aloysius Pre-University College understands that the situation calls for a prudent judgment on its part to ensure that students are not academically hindered nor are facing any emotional turmoil in the wake of the present scenario. The college is determined to do its best to present an ebullient future for all its students and will continue to contribute to the tradition of excellence in all its pursuits.



Student Strength & Batches

The SAPUC campus is abuzz with vibrant, youthful and positive energy of 4171 students studying in 58 Batches, 29 - Science, 25 Commerce and 4 of Arts in I & II PUC.

II PU Board Exam 2020

The students have made the institution proud with 98.38% in the II PU Board exam 2020. Out of 1976 students who appeared for the exam, 623 have secured Distinctions and 1166 have scored First Class. Students of Science stream have secured 98.90%, the toppers Jacika J Pinto and Khadeeja Nufrh secured 586/600 (97.67%). Commerce and Arts stream students obtained 98.41% and 93.07% respectively. From the Commerce stream, Amith Antony Saldanha and Preema Maria Fernandes scored the highest with 591/600 (98.5%), while the topper from Arts, Disha Rajesh Suvarna secured 580/600 (96.67%).

The students from the Commerce stream, Amith Antony Saldanha and Preema Maria Fernandes secured the 7th rank in the state with a total of 591/600 (98.5%), Shravya secured the 8th rank with a total 590/600 (98.33%) and Darren Fernandes secured 9th rank with a total of 589/600 (98.16%).

INFRASTRUCTURE

The College provides modern infrastructural facilities which consist of spacious classrooms with LCD projectors, well-stocked library, cafeteria, conference rooms, auditoriums for workshops and seminars, well-equipped laboratories, computer and language labs with internet facility, CCTV surveillance, vast playground, elevators for the staff etc. The college also provides hostel facilities for boys and girls with all the essential requirements. From sports facilities to language labs, the college has it all.

Science Block



The Science Block comprises 34 well-ventilated and well-lit classrooms, 2 galleried AV rooms, 6 well-equipped laboratories for (Chemistry), (Physics), (Computer Science), (Biology), (Home Science) and (Electronics) Library, Vice Principal's Office, Dean's Office, Counselor's Room, Department of Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Computer Science, Biology, Electronics, Hindi, an Indoor Sports Complex, a Cafeteria, Infirmary for boys and girls, and washrooms.

Gonzaga Block

Gonzaga Block comprises 33 well-ventilated and well-lit classrooms. The building houses offices of the Principal, Vice Principal, Dean, Finance and Administration, Counselors' Rooms, Library, Language Lab, Prayer Room - Sanidhya, Home Science Lab, Book Store, Board Room, Departments of Commerce, Arts, Statistics, English and Language, cafeteria, washrooms and a new addition to this building is a state-of-the-art Music Room. The Ladies' room in the block is equipped with a sanitary napkin incinerator.

COLLEGE FACILITIES

The College has a SMS alert service for attendance and performance reports. The attendance status of each student is also displayed on the notice board and website every month. Regular Parent-Teacher meetings are held to support the overall formation of the students. College Website has been upgraded, and all the activities and programmes are updated regularly. Facebook and Instagram platforms are also used to keep in touch with the students, parents, Alumni and well-wishers. The college also brings out a biannual Newsletter 'The Aloysian' as well as the Annual College Magazine.

The students' performance is evaluated time and again by conducting regular tests and exams, the results of which are sent to parents through the College SMS App. Continuous monitoring of academic performance helps the students remain focused on their academic goals.

The College wholeheartedly supports students who hail from underprivileged families. Facilities such as mid-day meals, fee concessions, scholarships, free textbooks, notebooks and college uniforms are offered to help these families educate their children without too much strain. In addition, alumni readily donate their textbooks to these students for their personal use.

Counselling Services

The College has employed four professional counsellors who use a wide range of counselling approaches to help students cope with their academic and emotional distress. The counsellors also take time out to offer special counselling services to students who experience learning difficulties and students with attendance issues. The counsellors have helped numerous students overcome their challenges and tap their potential.

Lady Students' Grievance Cell

The Lady Students' Grievance Cell provides a keen and active ear to the grievances of lady students of the College. The College also has an Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) which caters to the needs of lady students and staff.

Medical Facilities

Keeping in mind the well-being of our staff and students, SAPUC has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with Yenepoya Hospital to provide medical care, whereby the doctors of this hospital provide emergency health care on a priority basis.

Snack Counters

The College canteen provides healthy, hygienic, and nutritious food to the students and staff. 'Al-Café' and two more refreshment counters 'Al-Bistro' and 'Al-Chills', serve food and refreshments at reasonable price.

CHARACTER DEVELOPMENT AND FAITH FORMATION

Campus Ministry

Campus Ministry fosters a culture of Christian faith by promoting the spiritual wellness of students and staff. Rooted in Catholic and Jesuit heritage, this endeavour involves the affirmation of religious belief and practice within the College, through Eucharistic celebration, Prayer, Retreats, Theology classes, and Sacrament of Confession.

Value Education

Value Education is an integral part of education at SAPUC. Value education classes aim to create compassionate, conscientious, and confident individuals who live by the mission and vision of their Alma Mater.

Eminent resource persons are invited to the College to enlighten the students on relevant and fundamental issues such as social analysis, environmental concerns, health and hygiene, drug abuse, interreligious harmony, cybercrime, and suicide prevention. Prayer sessions in the prayer room Sanidhya also help students to experience the significance of spirituality and devotion.

Theology

Theology classes for Catholic students are aimed at taking students closer to God through experiential learning of the life and teachings of Jesus Christ. Apart from this, Catholic students are provided with an opportunity to participate in the Holy Eucharist which is celebrated on all special occasions.

ACADEMIC FACILITIES

Class Guide System

Each class is assigned a teacher who looks after the needs of the class and takes a keen interest in the welfare of students. The teachers guide the students in their academic performance and motivate them to excel in co-curricular activities.

Communicative English

The Department of English conducts Communicative English classes to train students in grammar, vocabulary and comprehension which enhance their soft skills.

NATA (National Aptitude Test in Architecture)

The College offers a training programme for NATA, a National Level Examination for admission to undergraduate courses in architecture. The intensive preparatory course is conducted in association with DQ labs.

NDA (National Defence Academy)

The College prepares its students for the entrance exam to the National Defence Academy which is the joint services academy of the Indian Armed Forces.

Communicative French

French is the second most widely learned language globally after English. The Department of French conducts Spoken French classes for students of I and II PUC. The course trains students in the following areas: grammar, speaking skills, reading skills, vocabulary enhancement, and writing skills.

Special Integrated Commerce Batch



SAPUC provides a CA (CPT) & CS Foundation Course for students aspiring to pursue CA & CS. This course is delivered by the qualified professionals, well-experienced College staff and renowned Chartered Accountants.

Integrated PCMB/PCBH/PCME/PCMC/PCMS Batch

Regular integrated batches have been formed to provide intensive coaching for CET and NEET along with the regular curriculum.

Special Integrated Batch For JEE/NEET

This special integrated batch includes aspirants of various competitive exams like JEE and NEET. They have been inducted into a special batch to prepare them to excel in academics as well as other exams. Air-conditioned classrooms, personal lockers, and a separate library facility are made available to the students to access academic and competitive exam reference material. To enable students face the challenges of competitive exams like JEE and NEET, the College has signed an MOU with Aakash Educational Services Limited for providing coaching.

Career Guidance

Delivering quality education, which is responsive to the ever-changing economic and workforce demands, is a hallmark of St Aloysius PU College. The Career Guidance Cell of the College facilitates and guides students to identify various career choices. It also helps them identify their aptitudes, interests, strengths and plan their academics.

Counselling Department

Yeh Dil Maange More!

13 Jammu and Kashmir Rifles i.e JAK Rifles had completed their Kashmir tenure and its advance party had reached Shahjahanpur, which is their new location. Later after being acclimatized at Ghumri, it was asked to be the reserve of 56 Brigade for the capture of Tololing, but having suffered heavy casualties, they had to drop the mission. Eventually, 18 Rajputana rifles had captured Tololing.

After the capture, 13 JAK Rifles walked for 12 hours from Dras to reach Tololing. Alpha company took over Tololing and a portion of hump complex from 18 Grenadiers. Commanding officer Lt Col Yogesh Joshi briefed two young and energetic officers to whom he had tasked the capture of Pt.5140, the most formidable feature in the Dras Sub-Sector. They could see the peak in front with enemy bunkers but couldn't make their strength. The two officers were none other than Lt Vikram Batra of Delta Company and Lt Sanjeev Jamval of Bravo Company. Having briefed thoroughly, Col Sahib asked them what would be their success signal sounds if they complete the tasks given to them. Lt Jamval replied "Oh, yeah, yeah, yeah". When asked the reason for such a signal, he replied that he was in the hunter squadron in the National Defence Academy where the same slogan was used. Later Lt Col Joshi turned to Lt Vikram and asked him what his signal would be, Vikram thinking for a while, replied "Yeh Dil Maange More!" When he was asked the reason for such signal he answered that he would not want to stop after that one success and would continue looking out for more bunkers to capture.

On the night of the capture of point 5140, it was a pitch dark night and a perfect time to attack the enemies. The assigned Indian army soldiers started to climb the

mountain. The Indian army plastered the entire feature with high explosives. It was like the whole feature was set on fire and the commanding officer was in hope that the enemy up were dead. But luckily the Pakistani Soldiers occupied the reverse slope positions when the artillery was pounding them. The enemy started to fire at the Indian soldiers who were climbing. After a very very long time, At 04:40 hrs Lt col Joshi, heard the famous words "Yeh Dil maange more".

After coming down from the mountain, Batra called his parents on the satellite phone. His parents were proud of their Shershah. Later the battalion was reinducted from Dras to Ghumri to rest and recoup. Then a week later they moved to Mushkoh.

Now the second mission was the capture of Pt. 4875, where Batra proudly sacrificed his life for the nation. When Batra bent to save an injured soldier, a sniper pierced his chest and he attained martyrdoms.

The man who had survived so many bullets, killed enemies in hand to hand combat and even cleared away many Pakistani intruders, fearlessly putting his own life at stake many times, was destined to die by a sniper shot. Spurred by Batra's extreme courage and sacrifice, a squad of his men (each carrying AK-47) attacked the enemies on top. The fierceness of their attack frightened the Pakistanis so much that they had to run away to the edge and jump off the cliff. When told by a friend to be careful in the war, Batra had then replied "Either I will hoist the Tricolour or I will come back wrapped in it"

Batra in his younger days:

A little boy often alongside his identical twin, their mother called them Luv and kush. They didn't have a television in their home, they would often sneak out of their home to their neighbour, Nisha Didi's home so they could watch the TV serial Param Vir Chakra, which would be aired every Sunday. The twins would be so proud and filled with pride and marvelled at the bravery of the men who had been awarded India's highest gallantry award the 'Param Vir Chakra'.

His Family:

Captain Vikram Batra's father, Mr Girdhari Lal Batra says "We are proud of him and feel good that people are paying their respects to martyrs like Vikram on this day. Vikram was an outstanding and extraordinary boy, sincere and brilliant. I knew he was much ahead of ordinary people. He was given the name

'Shershah' because he was very brave," he says with pride his voice choking with emotion.

Captain Vikram Batra's mother, Kamal Kanta says "She would sometimes wonder why she was given two sons when she has only asked for one. Now she understands that one was meant for the nation and the other was meant for the family".

Captain Vikram Batra's identical twin Vishal Batra says "Death is the ultimate truth of my life but how many of us have the courage to face death with open arms? My brother Vikram was the Param Vir - Bravest of the brave."

The government of India posthumously awarded Captain Vikram Batra, India's highest gallantry award the Param Vir Chakra for his sacrifice for the nation during the Kargil war 1999.





5. Depression and Social Isolation


Posting stories, adding filters have become a global trend. Users posts their happiest and delightful moments on their social networking sites.



Raksha: Comment la France a-t-elle géré la situation du Covid-19?

Juliette: La France a mis en place un confinement stricte l'année dernière qui a duré de mars à mai environ. Il a été retiré pour l'été, mais les déplacements à l'étranger étaient compliqués. Ensuite, vers novembre, nous avons été confinés moins strictement car la situation s'empirait vraiment. Nous pouvions juste aller à l'école ou au travail, ainsi que faire des achats de première nécessité. Ce confinement n'a pas été très bien respecté et aujourd'hui, nous ne sommes plus confinés.

Raksha: Le gouvernement français a-t-il commencé à distribuer des vaccins?

Juliette: Oui, plus de 2 millions de français ont déjà reçu leur première injection de vaccin. Le gouvernement

français a commencé par les personnes les plus âgées, puis les soignants et les personnes fragiles. Le rythme reste assez lent comparé à d'autres pays européens mais c'est sur la bonne voie!

Raksha: À votre avis, qu'est-ce que la France aurait pu faire de mieux dans sa lutte contre Covid-19?

Juliette: Je pense que la France aurait pu éviter certaines demi mesures comme le confinement allégé de novembre. Je pense également que les écoles auraient dû fermer à ce moment. La principale erreur du gouvernent a été de retarder les aménagements dans les établissements scolaires. Même aujourd'hui, un protocole avec des horaires aménagés est recommandé mais chaque école fait comme elle le veut...

Raksha: Comment les jeunes ont-ils fait face à Covid-19?

Comment avez-vous fait face au Covid-19?

Juliette: La situation a été très compliquée pour les jeunes. Les lycées sont ouverts mais les universités sont fermées depuis le début de l'année, et les étudiants en souffrent réellement. Comme partout ailleurs, le manque de contact social pèse sur la jeunesse et il est dur d'avoir l'impression de perdre les meilleures années de nos vies...

Personnellement, il y a eu des moments compliqués, surtout au début de l'année scolaire, mais aujourd'hui malgré le couvre-feu, j'arrive à avoir des contacts sociaux et profiter de mes amis en faisant attention.

Raksha: Si vous aviez la chance de dire quelque chose à Covid-19, que diriez-vous?

Juliette: Je pense que je lui demanderait de partir haha. Ce virus a causé bien trop de dégâts et s'installe un peu trop à mon goût. J'aimerai tellement pouvoir retrouver ma vie d'avant.







La pandémie de covid-19 a complètement changé les vies des étudiants du monde entier. Elle a été une période très difficile pour nombreuses familles. Pour un étudiant comme moi-même, la pandémie a fait beaucoup de modifications à mon mode de vie. D'abord, des cours ont été maintenant suivis en ligne (cours en distanciel). മലയാള ഭാഷയെക്കുറിച്ച് മഹാകവി വള്ളത്തോൾ എഴുതിയ വരികൾ ഏറെ പ്രസ്തുതമാണ്.

ഹൈട്ടക്ക് ജനത അന്യഭാഷകളുടെ അടിമകളാക്കുകയാണോ... അവിടെ അടിമത്വത്തിന്റെ ചുവയുമുണ്ട്. ഏത് യന്ത്രവത്കൃത ലോകത്തു ജീവിച്ചാലും, ഏത് സാങ്കേതിക വിദ്യയുടെ ചുവട്ടിൽ കിടന്നാലും മലയാള ഭാഷയെയും സംസ്കാരത്തെയും മറക്കുന്നത് പെറ്റമ്മയെ മറക്കുന്നതിന് തുല്യമാണ്.

മറ്റുള്ളവർ നമ്മുടെ ഭാഷയെ ദ്രാവിഡ തനിമയും പാരമ്പര്യവും, അതിലേറെ ക്ലാസിക്ക് കൃതികളുടെ മാതൃസങ്കേതമായും കാണുമ്പോൾ മലയാളികൾ ഭാഷയെ അവഗണിക്കുകയും അപമാനിക്കുകയും ചെയ്യുന്നു. ഇതിങ്ങനെ തുടർന്നാൽ മലയാളത്തെ മാതൃസ്സേഹത്തിന്റെ അമ്മിഞ്ഞപ്പാൽ മധുരം പോലെ ഹൃദയത്തിലും നാവിലും ഊറി നടന്നിരുന്ന കാവ്യ ചക്രവർത്തിമാരായ വള്ളത്തോളും ഇടശ്ശേരിയും പി. കുഞ്ഞിരാമൻ നായരും കഥാസാമ്രാജ്യത്തിലെ നിത്യ

വിസ്മയങ്ങളായ തകഴിയും, ബഷീറും, കേശവദേവുമൊക്കെ മലയാള ഭാഷയെ വികൃതവും വികലവുമാക്കുന്ന ആധുനിക മലയാളിയുടെ മിഥ്യാഭിമാനത്തെ വാക്ക്ഗദകൊണ്ട് അടിച്ചു വീഴ്ത്താൻ പുനർജ്ജനിക്കും ഉറപ്പ്.

ആശയവിനിമയത്തിന് മാതൃഭാഷയായ മലയാളം ഉപയോഗിക്കുമ്പോഴും മുഴത്തിനു മുന്നുറു വീതം ഇംഗ്ലീഷ് വാക്കുകൾ ഉപയോഗിച്ച് ലോകവിജ്ഞാനം പ്രകടിപ്പിക്കുന്നവരായി മലയാളി മാറിക്കഴിഞ്ഞു. അമ്മയുടെ മുലപ്പാലിനൊപ്പം മലയാളിയിലുണ്ടായ കേരളീയതയാണ് മലയാളം. നമുക്ക് എന്തെല്ലാമുണ്ടെന്നു പറഞ്ഞാലും നാം നേടിയെന്നിരുന്നാലും എന്തെന്തു സ്തേഹിക്കുന്നവരല്ലെങ്കിൽ മാതൃഭാഷയെ അതിലധികം പോരായ്യയില്ലെന്നറിയണം. അതിനർത്ഥം നാം ഭാഷാഹങ്കാരികളാകണമെന്നല്ല, ഭാഷാഭിമാനികളാകണമെന്ന് തന്നെയാണ്.

വളരുമെന്ന് അതൊരു തിരിച്ചറിവായി തിരുത്തലായി മനസ്സിലുണ്ടാവണം.

ലഹരിയുടെ ഉപയോഗം യുവതലമുറയിൽ ക്രമാതീതമായി വർധിച്ച് വരുന്ന അവസ്ഥയാണ് നമുക്ക് കാണാൻ സാധിക്കുന്നത്. എന്തിനേറെ പറയണം ഒന്നാം ക്ലാസ് വിദ്യാർത്ഥി മുതൽ ഇന്ന് ലഹരിയുടെ അടിമയായി മാറുന്ന കാലഘട്ടം. കലാലയ ജീവിതത്തിൽ നിന്ന് തുടങ്ങി തന്റെ ഏറ്റവും മനോഹരമായ ബാലുകാലത്തെ മദൃത്തിനും, മയക്കുമരുന്നിനും അടിമപ്പെടുത്തികൊണ്ട് സുന്ദരമായ ജീവിതത്തേയും, ആരോഗ്യത്തെയും നശിപ്പിക്കുന്ന ഇതൊക്കെയും എന്ത് കൊണ്ട് ദുരവസ്ഥ. സംഭവിക്കുന്നു എന്ന കാര്യം നാം വിലയിരുത്തേണ്ടിയിരിക്കുന്നു.

വളരെ ഉത്സാഹത്തോടെ സ്കൂളിൽ പോകുകയും കൂട്ടുകാരും വിട്ടുകാരുമായി സന്തോഷത്തോടെ സമയം ചെലവിടുകയും ചെയ്ത ബാല്യം പെട്ടന്നാണ് ഒരുനാൾ മൂകമായി മാറിയത്. ഒന്നിലുമൊരു താൽപരുമില്ലായ്യയും നന്നായി പഠിച്ചിരുന്ന ആ പഠനത്തിൽ നിന്ന് ബാല്യം പെട്ടെന്ന് പിന്നോക്കമാവുകയും ചെയ്യുന്നു. സംശയം തോന്നിയ വീട്ടുകാർ ഒരു ഡോക്ടറുടെ അടുത്ത് കൊണ്ടു പോവുകയും വിശദപരിശോധനയിൽ കുട്ടി മയക്ക് മരുന്നിനും മദൃത്തിനും അടിമയാണെന്ന് മനസ്സിലാകുന്നു. കൂടുതൽ അപകടകളിലേക്ക് വഴുതിവീഴും മുൻപ് കണ്ടെത്തിയതോടെ ആ ബാലൃത്തെ പതിയെ സാധാരണ ജീവിതത്തിലേക്ക് മടക്കി കൊണ്ട് വരാൻ സാധിച്ചു. ഇതൊരു ഒറ്റപ്പെട്ട സംഭവമല്ല. കൗമരക്കാരായ യുവബാലൃങ്ങൾക്കിടയിൽ മദൃത്തിന്റെയും മയക്കുമരുന്നിന്റെയും ഉപയോഗം ദിനംപ്രതി വർദ്ധിച്ചുവരുകയാണ്. മദ്യം, മയക്കുമരുന്ന്, പുകയില, ലഹരി വസ്തുക്കൾ എന്നിവ കുട്ടികൾക്കിടയിൽ വ്യാപകമാകുമ്പോൾ ഇത് കുട്ടികളുടെ ആരോഗ്യത്തെ സാരമായി ബാധിക്കുമെന്ന കാര്യത്തിൽ നമുക്ക് സംശയം വേണ്ട.

അതോടൊപ്പം തന്നെ വളരെ ഗൗരവത്തോടെ കാണേണ്ട ഒന്നാണ് ലഹരിവസ്തുക്കളുടെ ഉപയോഗം കുട്ടികളിൽ ഉണ്ടാകുന്ന വൈക്തിത്വ വൈകല്യങ്ങൾ. പെട്ടൊന്നൊരു സുപ്രഭാതത്തിൽ തുടങ്ങുന്നതല്ല ലഹരിവസ്തുക്കളുടെ ഉപയോഗം, വളരെ സാവധാനമാണ് കുട്ടികൾ പലപ്പോഴും ലഹരിക്ക് അടിമപ്പെടുന്നത്. എന്തുകൊണ്ടും ചില മോശമായ കൂട്ടുകെട്ടുകൾ തന്നെയാണ് ഇത്തരം സാഹചരൃങ്ങളിലേക്ക് കൊണ്ടു ചെന്നിത്തിരിക്കുന്നതും.

വീട്ടിലെ പ്രശ്നങ്ങൾ, വിഷാദരോഗം, ടെൻഷൻ, പ്രണയ നൈരാഗ്യം തുടങ്ങി അധികമായി ലഭിക്കുന്ന പോക്കറ്റ് മണി എന്ത് ചെയ്യണമെന്നറിയാതെ നടക്കുന്നവർ, കൂട്ടുകാരിൽ നിന്ന് നിറം പിടിച്ച കഥകൾ കേട്ടുള്ള ആവേശം അങ്ങനെ പലതരത്തിലുള്ള മാനസിക പ്രശ്നങ്ങൾ അഭിമുഖീകരിക്കുന്ന കുട്ടികൾ ഇത്തരം മോശമായ കൂട്ടുകെട്ടുകളിലേക്ക് പെട്ടെന്ന് ചെന്നുവീഴുകയും ചെയ്യുന്നു.

കൂടാതെ ഇവരെ വലവിശി പിടിക്കാനായി സ്കൂളുകളും, ഹോസ്റ്റലുകളും കേന്ദ്രീകരിച്ച് മയക്കു മരുന്നിന്റെ റാക്കറ്റുകൾ തന്നെ പ്രവർത്തിക്കുന്നുണ്ട്. ആദ്യമൊക്കെ ഒരു രസത്തിനായി തുടങ്ങുന്ന ഈ ലഹരി ഉപയോഗം ക്രമേണ ഒഴിച്ചു കൂടാനാകാത്ത ശീലമായി മാറുന്നു. അത് ക്രമേണ ആസക്തിയിലേക്കും അടിമത്തത്തിലേക്കും നീങ്ങുന്നു.

അടുത്തിടെ നടത്തിയ ഒരു പഠനപ്രകാരം കൗമാരപ്രായത്തിൽ മദ്യത്തിനും മയക്കുമരുന്നിനും അടിമപ്പെടുന്ന കുട്ടികൾ ഭാവിയിൽ പലതരത്തിലുള്ള സംകീർണതകൾ നേരിടേണ്ടി വരുന്നു. ഇവരുടെ വിദ്യാഭ്യാസം, ജോലി, വിവാഹജീവിതം, സാമൂഹികബന്ധങ്ങൾ എന്നിവയിലെല്ലാം ഇതിന്റെ ആഘാതങ്ങൾ വൃക്തമാണെന്നു പഠനം പറയുന്നു. അമേരിക്കൻ പബ്ലിക്ക് ഹെൽത്ത് അസോസിയേഷന്റെ റിപ്പോർട്ട് പ്രകാരം ഇത്തരത്തിൽ ഒരിക്കൽ മയക്കുമരുന്നിനു അടിമയായിരിന്നവർക്ക് അവരുടെ മുന്നോട്ടുള്ള ജീവിതത്തിൽ സമപ്രായക്കാരെ പോലെ മുന്നേറാൻ കഴിയാതെ വരികയും ചെയ്യുന്നു.

നിരന്തരമായ ലഹരി ഉപയോഗം ബുദ്ധിശേഷിയിൽ ഗണ്യമായ കുറവ് വരുത്തുമെന്ന് ഗവേഷണങ്ങൾ പറയുമ്പോൾ 1165 കുട്ടികളിൽ അവരുടെ 12 വയസ്സ് മുതൽ 25 വയസ്സ് വരെ നടത്തിയ പഠനങ്ങളിൽ ഇത് വ്യക്തമാക്കുന്നുമുണ്ട്.

കൂടാതെ ലഹരിയുടെ ദോഷവശങ്ങൾ ഒരാളെ ബാധിക്കുക ശാരീരികവും മാനസികമായുമാണ്. അമിതമായ ലഹരി ഉപയോഗം കാലക്രമേണ ഓർമ്മ, ചിന്ത, സ്വബോധം എന്നിവ നഷ്ടമാക്കുന്നു. വൈകാതെ കുട്ടി കടുത്ത ആകാംക്ഷ, ഭയം, സംശയം, ശ്രദ്ധയില്ലായ്യ, നിരുത്സാഹം എന്നിവയ്ക്കും അടിമപ്പെടുന്നു എന്ന് പാനങ്ങൾ വ്യക്തമാക്കുന്നു.

പ്രായത്തിൽ ഒരുപക്ഷെ കൗമാര ഒരു ആവേശമായി തുടങ്ങുന്ന ലഹരിവസ്തുക്കളുടെ ജീവിതത്തിൽ ഒഴിച്ച് ഉപയോഗം അതിൽ അലിഞ്ഞ് കൂടാനാകാത്തതോളം തീരുമ്പോൾ അവസാന നിമിഷം ബാക്കിയാകുന്നത് ഒരാറ്റ ശ്വാസം മാത്രമായിരിക്കും. മദുലഹരിയിൽ പൊലിഞ്ഞ് പോകുന്ന ബാലൃങ്ങളെ ഓർത്ത് വിശമിക്കേണ്ടവരല്ല നമ്മൾ, സാധാരണ ജീവിത്തിലേക്ക് തിരിച്ച് കൊണ്ട് വരേണ്ടതാണ്. അത് നമ്മുടെ സാമുഹിക ബാധൃതയും കൂടിയാണ്. നേരത്തെ അൻപത് വയസ്സിനു മുകളിലുള്ളവരായിരുന്നു മദൃത്തിനും മയക്ക് മരുന്നിനും അടിമകളായി ചികിത്സയ്ക്കെത്തിയിരുന്നതെങ്കിൽ ഇന്നവരുടെ പ്രായം 14 ആണ്. പതിനാലം വയസ്സിൽ ഒരാൾ ലഹരിക്കടിമയായി മാരണമെങ്കിൽ അവൻ ഏത് കാലത്ത് തുടങ്ങിയിട്ടുണ്ടാകണം ഈ ശീലം?

ഇന്ത്യയുടെ സോഷ്യൽ ഡവലപ്മെന്റ് നടത്തിയ സർവേയിലെ വിവരങ്ങൾ.
